What We Do

Gifts are invested to generate long-term income, distinguishing them from funds used for day-to-day operations. Portions of the investment earnings are **distributed quarterly** to the Church. Once transferred, the Church makes spending decisions in accordance with any donor restrictions.

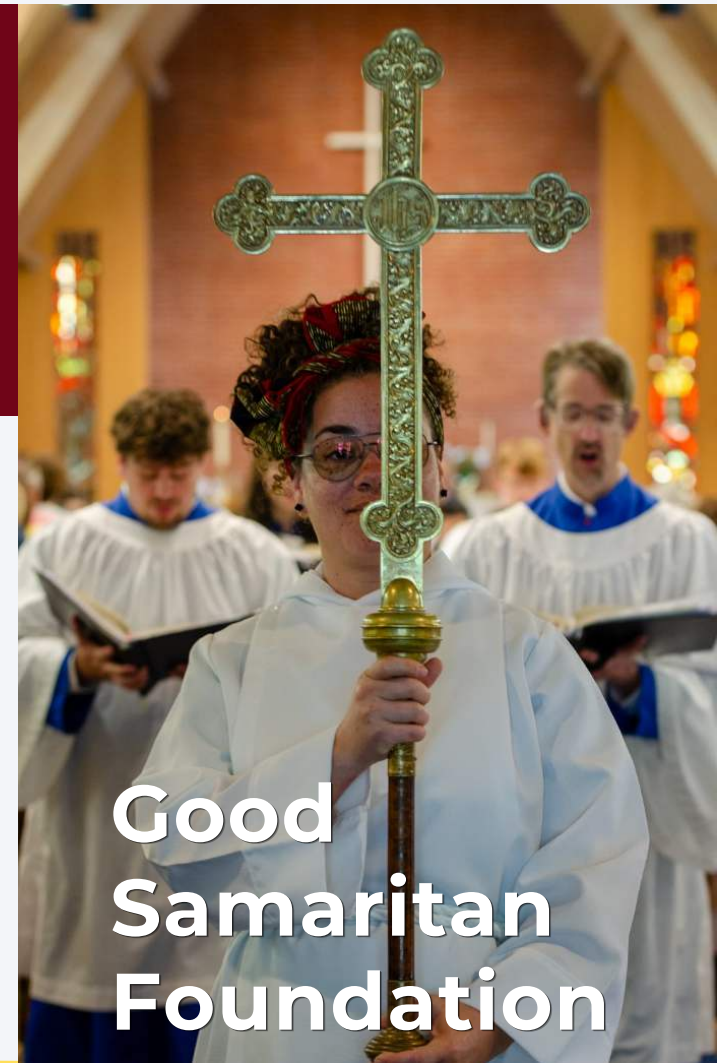

How Foundation Money is Managed

Our Diocesan investment committee has created two managed funds:

- 1 Diocesan Investment Fund (DIF) -**
Has guidelines that exclude industries such as tobacco, fossil fuels, and military contracting.
- 2 Socially Responsible Investment Fund (SRIF) -**
Builds on DIF investment principles, prioritizing investments in clean technology, community development, equal opportunity, and human rights.

Trustees of the Foundation annually review the allocation between the funds.
